

A petition of a number of inhabitants of the county of Botetourt, whole names are thereunto fubfcribetl, was prefented and read, fetting forth, that prior to the year 1787, no perfon in the county was employed to collect the public revenue; that in confequence thereof, the petitioners in being compelled to pay the arrearages heretofore due, as well is those which have accrued fince, labor under great difadvantages; and praying that they may be permitted to pay the amount of their certificate taxes in fpecie, according to the value of certificates, at the time the fame became due.

A petition of fun. y inhabitants of various parts of this flate, whole names are thereunto fublicribed, was prefented and read, fetting forth, that they confider flavery not only a moral but a political evil, which in all its forms, and degrees, is an outrageous violation and odious degradation of man, tending to weaken the bands of fociety, and endanger the peace and obfirust the profperity of the country; and praying that in all may pass to ameliorate the prefer condition of flaves, and give freedom to fuch as A.all be born after the passing of the faid act.

Ordered. That the faid petition be referred to a committee of the whole Houle, on the 31ft day of March next.

Refaired, That a committee be appointed to prepare effimates of the expences of civil government and of the public debt, and to report their opinion of the provision which ought to be made for the fupport of government and payment of the public tiebt.

Ordered, That the faid petitioa be referred to a committee of the whole Houfe, on Monday the 30th inflant.

A petition of Robert Reagh was prefented and read, fetting forth, that he intermatried with a certain Martha Meek, lived with her upwards of nine years in content and harmony, and in the courfe of that time had a numerous offspring; that notwithflanding thefe ties upon her fidelity, fhe eloped from him three years ago, with a certain John Ewing, and has fince continued to refide with him in open adultery; and praying that an act may pafs, authorifing fome court of record to take cognizance of the fafts therein flated, and directing the chancellor to pronounce a decree of divorce accordingly.
